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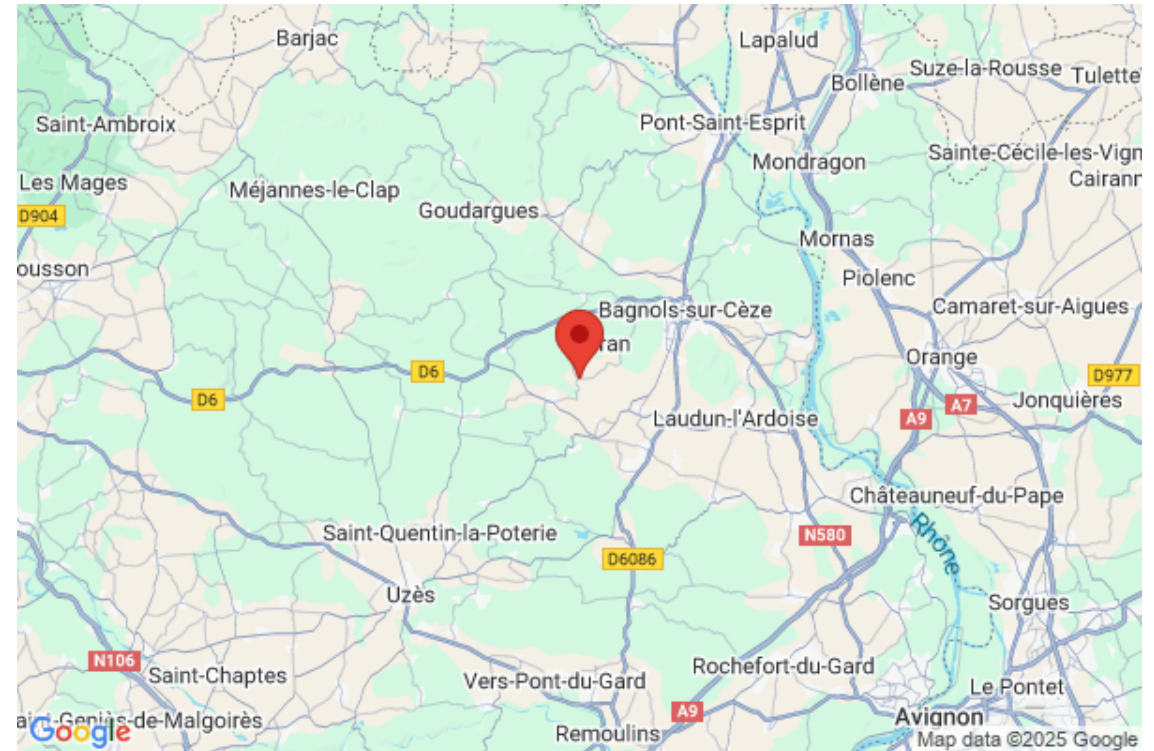
Location

Uzès was the starting point for the Roman Aqueduct of Nîmes and the seat of a diocese until the Revolution. Its 400 plus shops and a number of year-round activities make it a lively town.
